Item 1 : **Acknowledgement Under Section 18004(a)(l) of the CARES Act**

The Universidad Central del Caribe (UCC), hereby acknowledges that our institution signed and returned to the Department of Education on May 1, 2021, the Certification and Agreement (ALN84.425E) (a)(l) Student Aid Portion required under the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

Also, hereby UCC assures that the institution used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP(a) (1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Item 2

UCC received a total amount \$152,542.00 of funds from the Department of Education pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP(a)(4) programs

Item 3

UCC has distributed a total amount of \$152,540.69 from the Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP(a)(l) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission.

The undistributed \$1.31 was added to the distribution of the HEERF III ARP.

Item 4

At UCC, the total number of students eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSAA and ARP(a)(l) and (a)(4) programs are 493 students.

Item 5

At UCC, the total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and the CARES Act CRRSAA and ARP(a)(1) and (a)(4) programs of the CARES Act as of the date of submission are 493.

Item 6

Method used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aids Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and the CARES Act CRRSAA and ARP(a)(1) and (a)(4) programs of the CARES Act:

The Universidad Central del Caribe (UCC) determined the following guidelines to establish eligibility of our students for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) emergency assistance provided by the CARES Act:

- Students must be actively enrolled in one of our academic programs, conducive to complete an academic degree or certificate, during the academic terms affected by the Coronavirus pandemic and continue as an active student during the emergency. Any student that did not fit into this definition were deemed no eligible to receive the emergency aid.
- CRRSAA requires that institutions prioritized students with exceptional need, such as students who receive PELL Grants, in awarding financial aid grants to students. However, students do not need to be only PELL recipients or students who are eligible for PELL grants. In addition, the CRRSAA explicitly provides that financial aid grants to students may be provided to students exclusively enrolled in distance education.
- Students have filed or may file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) were deemed eligible. As an alternative to students, who under special conditions cannot complete a FAFSA, may demonstrate eligibility by completing an application in which the student attests under the penalty of perjury to meeting the requirements of Section 484 of the HEA.

The students of UCC received from the CRRSAA emergency assistance funds. As the UCC understood that all of our students have been experiencing different economic stresses due to the public health emergency caused by COVID-19, the funds were distributed among all eligible students amounting to the total enrolled and active students, based on the following criteria:

- Based on the CRRSAA requirement of the prioritization of students with exceptional needs in distributing financial aid grants, UCC determined the financial need based on the EFC ratio.

- Students with an EFC=0 received \$315.64 while students with an EFC>0 or students that did not fill the FAFSA received \$286.95.

Item 7

Instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

UCC provided the following communications to the students related to the CARES Act Emergency Aid:

- ✓ May 6, 2021 – E-mail to students describing the purpose of the CRRSAA funds under the HEERF II grant and giving them the instructions to fill out the direct deposit authorization to facilitate the reimbursement of the fund and explaining the method used for the assignment of the funds.
